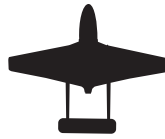


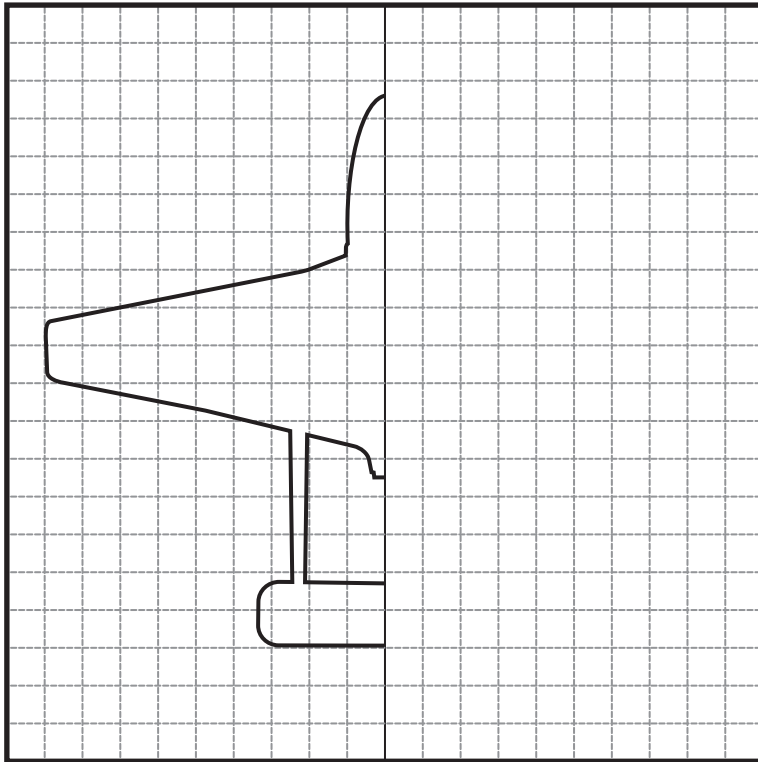
De Havilland D.H.100 Vampire F.B. Mk.5

In 1952 the Vampire entered service in the RNZAF, marking the beginning of the jet age for New Zealand aviation. They served in a day fighter and ground attack role, and later as a jet conversion trainer.

McDonnell Douglas A-4K Skyhawk
